Co-Production in Action: Strategies and Stories Behind Nordic Co-Productions

Venue: Bioplatset 6

How do collaborations across borders fuel ambitious filmmaking? In this session, we examine the growing potential of Nordic co-productions through two standout case studies – *Handling the Undead* and *Quiet Life* – along with insights from key film funds supporting these partnerships.

Handling the Undead, a Norwegian-led project co-produced with Sweden, Denmark, and Greece, premiered at Sundance and opened the Göteborg Film Festival 2024. *Quiet Life*, a French-led production co-produced with Sweden, Finland, Estonia, Greece and Germany, will screen at the festival in 2025 following its Venice premiere. Joining the panel are the producers of these films: **Kristin Emblem**, Einar Film, and **Olivier Guerpillon**, Fox in the Snow.

The panel also highlights new initiatives boosting Nordic-European collaborations. **Helge Albers**, CEO of Hamburg's MOIN Film Fund, discusses MOIN's

expanded opportunities to support Nordic co-productions, while **Joakim Rang Strand**, Head of Production of Film i Skåne, shares how regional funding fosters international partnerships.

Meet the New Nordic Voices

The Nordic Film Schools educate storytellers of tomorrow. And as a result, they each bear a significant responsibility in what kinds of films and series the future holds for us.

The NORD project was hatched from an idea of taking on this responsibility by facilitating artistic and cultural cross-country networks, unearthing all that makes Nordic narratives special.

The visionary project launched in 2021 at the National Film School of Denmark. Thanks to generous support from A.P Møller Foundation, students from The Norwegian Film School, Stockholm University of the Arts, and the National Film School of Denmark were given a unique opportunity to tap into new creative communities across the Nordic borders.

This year's Göteborg Film Festival marks a project peak, as students and graduates from each school present their take on the new Nordic storytelling to an audience of industry stakeholders.

By letting an entire generation of Nordic filmmakers get to know each other creatively, culturally and personally, students have been given the resources needed to create works of a lasting cultural footprint.

Navigating the Future

Nostradamus

Since 2013, the Göteborg Film Festival's Nostradamus initiative has provided forward-looking insights into the future of the audiovisual industry.

Authored by media analyst Johanna Koljonen, the annual reports track emerging trends in business models, distribution, and audience behaviour, offering valuable guidance for industry professionals and policymakers across Europe.

The initiative hosts seminars at key festivals, including Cannes' Marché du Film and Berlin's European Film Market.

The 12th Nostradamus Report will be unveiled in May 2025 at Marché du Film.

The Nostradamus Project is presented by Göteborg Film Festival in partnership with Boost HBG, Kulturakademin and Lindholmen Science Park, with additional funding from Creative Europe MEDIA, Region Västra Götaland and Nordisk Film & TV Fond.

Nostradamus Collective

– Collaboration as Innovation

Launching in 2025, the Nostradamus Collective is an initiative under the Nostradamus project, fostering collaboration and transparency among current and future industry leaders.

The first invitation-only session will take place at the Göteborg Film Festival on January 29, in Drama Hall. Moderated by **Johanna Koljonen**, this closed-door "fishbowl" discussion will bring together 30 selected professionals to explore the state of the audiovisual sector. Insights from this session will be published in February.

Throughout the year, the Nostradamus Collective will partner with international markets and

organizations to develop additional sessions aligned with the initiative's goals.

The Nostradamus Collective creates space for sharing experiences, identifying challenges, and generating possible solutions – enhancing the industry's collective to navigate change and thrive.

Hanna lives in a New Age Christian community in rural Denmark and longs to have a child. But her sheltered life starts to unravel as the unexpected arrival of her younger brother Jacob stirs up long-buried memories of their troubled past. Will his arrival threaten Hanna's dream of becoming a mother? And will the members of the community be able to live up to their own rules and beliefs, when they are confronted with the question: who gets to decide over love?



Jeppe Rønde. Director Jeppe Rønde (b. 1973) has explored faith within different religions in his documentaries *Jerusalem My Love* (2003) and *The Swenkas* (2004). Both premiered at IDFA and the latter earned a nomination for European Film Awards. Rønde's debut fiction

feature film, *Bridgend* (2015), about an out-break of teen suicides in Wales and starring Josh O'Connor in his first leading role, premiered at IFFR in The Tiger Competition and later picked up awards at Tribeca and Göteborg Film Festival. Rønde has also won acclaim for his extensive work in Commercials.

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Being Bo Widerberg

I huvudet på Bo



Being Bo Widerberg is the story of the acclaimed and eccentric director who in the shadow of Ingmar Bergman became Sweden's most influential film-maker. The film describes Widerberg's celebration during the progressive early 1960s, from being an aspiring author and a harsh critic in working-class Malmö to his heydays as hallmarked film auteur in Stockholm and on to adventures in Cannes and New York. The film also shows to what cost Bo Widerberg's career, or rather his ardent search for life, came at – on his colleagues, on his family and on himself.



Jon Asp is a critic, editor (*Point of View*) and author. *Being Bo Widerberg* marks his debut as director and scriptwriter.



Mattias Nohrborg is Founder of and Head of film acquisitions, at distribution company TriArt Film, and also an experienced producer at B-Reel Films. *Being Bo Widerberg* marks his debut as director.

Three adult sibling reunite after their father, a somewhat famous composer, dies. Though the process of emptying their childhood home, they are forced to confront their mutual past, each other – and their own individual life choices.



Arild Østin Ommundsen debuted in feature films with comedy hit *Mongoland* in 2001, and followed with surf drama *Monsterthursday* (Sundance, 2005). *It's Only Make Believe* (2013) was nominated for ten national film awards and *Now It's Dark* (2018) confirmed his standing as one of the most interesting auteurs in Scandinavia. In 2020 he wrote and directed the award winning *Sisters – the summer we found our superpowers*.

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Heroes of Tomorrow

Morgendagens helter



Heroes of Tomorrow is set during the covid-19 pandemic, and follows Margaret, an executive at a business school ridden with conflict. To reconcile her colleagues and bring them more in touch with nature, Margaret sets up a team-building event that eventually turns into a life-changing, transformative experience for everyone involved.



Mariken Halle (born Oslo, 1982) studied at the Academy of Valand in Gothenburg and *Heroes of Tomorrow* is her fourth feature length film. In her films she often mix actors with non-actors, real places and research with fictional elements trying to create a true and unexpected room for the audience. Earlier films have been shown at Cph:Dox, Karlovy Vary International Filmfestivals among others. Mariken is part of Alternativet production and in 2021 she was one of the founders of Jack Film Agency, an artist-run distribution structure bridging the gaps between screening venues and creators from the art and film world.

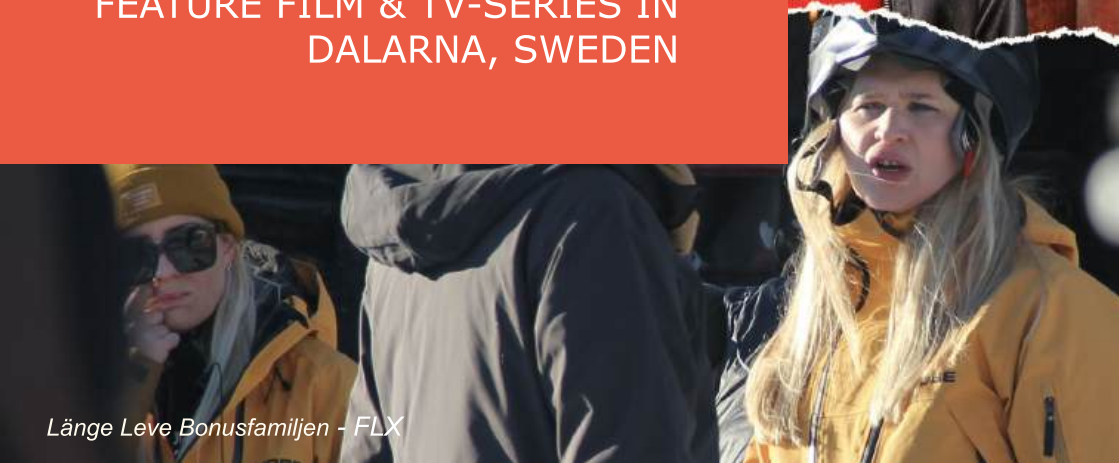
