The industry programme features more than 120 projects at various stages of development, complemented by nearly 250 speakers across our stages. In 2026, we welcome Germany as the Official Country in Focus at the Nordic Film Market and TV Drama

Vision, bringing a dynamic presence of producers, funds, and key decision-makers to Göteborg.

The 27th Nordic Film Market will showcase some of the most promising upcoming Nordic projects and talents, alongside a selection of international titles. This year the market relocates to Draken, together with an expanded insight programme.

TV Drama Vision celebrates its 20th anniversary under the headline *One Transformation After Another*, exploring future strategies for co-productions, evolving business models, audience-first storytelling, sustainable production, and the craft of writing compelling stories – presented alongside a strong selection of series from across Europe.

The Industry Guide is your companion throughout the festival, offering a comprehensive overview of the programme, screenings, seminars, and events. Use it to navigate everything from films and drama series in competition to networking opportunities and social gatherings. Hotel Draken and Cinema Draken remain our central hubs – places where ideas spark, deals take shape, and unforgettable moments unfold.

Industry Center

Attendees with Festival PRO, VIP, TV Drama Vision, Nordic Film Market and Press accreditations can book tickets online for the public screenings taking place the same day or the next. Please note that accredited with Festival accreditation cannot book tickets in advance, however you can queue at the door for the screenings and if there are seats available you can attend the screening.

Each accredited is eligible to up to four tickets per day. Tickets are released daily at 07:00 for screenings taking place the same day and the day after. Tickets are limited and can be booked on a first-come, first-served basis.

Nordic Film Market

The Nordic Film Market is the world's leading marketplace for Nordic cinema and the central meeting point for the international film industry during the Göteborg Film Festival. Showcasing new and upcoming films from Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, and Iceland, the market offers a unique gateway to the Nordic audiovisual landscape.

The 2026 programme features more than 70 titles, including 18 completed Nordic films, 19 Works in Progress, and 16 films in development presented through the market's co-production platform, Discovery. In addition, the international section Nordic Gateway will highlight 6 standout projects currently seeking financing and Nordic partners. These are complemented by projects presented in collaboration with Nordic film schools, among other initiatives.

With 700 registered international buyers, sales agents, festival programmers, financiers, and producers, the Nordic Film Market is a vibrant hub for discovering new projects, creative talent, and opportunities for international collaboration.

Starting in 2026, the Nordic Film Market will be hosted at Draken. Delegates can attend sessions and project presentations at Hotel Draken and the iconic Cinema Draken. Market screenings will take place at the festival's multiplex cinema, Biopal-atset, located just a 15-minute walk from Draken, and will be complemented by an online screening programme.

Nordic Film Market moderators are Wendy Mitchell, Jonas Pedersen Hardebrant and Johanna Koljonen.

Nordic Film Market is supported by the Nordisk Film & TV Fond, Creative Europe MEDIA, Region Västra Götaland, The Five Nordics and Film i Väst.

Nordic Series Awards

Presented by Nordisk Film & TV Fond

The Nordic Series Script Award, succeeding the Nordisk Film & TV Fond Prize awarded annually at TV Drama Vision since 2017, honors the best screenwriting in Nordic drama. Supported by Nordisk Film & TV Fond, the prestigious award grants NOK 200,000 (€17,000) to the main writer(s) of a Nordic drama series premiered the previous year.

Additional honorary mention – the Creative Courage Award – will celebrate the producer and commissioner behind bold and innovative storytelling.

TV Drama Vision

One Transformation After Another

In 2026, TV Drama Vision celebrates its 20th anniversary under the headline *One Transformation After Another*, with two days of insights and networking at the Nordic region's key series market. Showcasing 50 series and 100+ speakers on stage, it offers a focused look at the stories, formats and business models shaping today's industry.

At a time when reality moves faster than fiction – budgets shrink, formats multiply, and AI reshapes the production chain – the need for resilient strategies has never been greater. TV Drama Vision explores tomorrow's strategies to co-production, platform-fluid IP, audience-first approaches, smarter budgeting, sustainable production, and the art of writing great stories.

This year's programme begins with exclusive pre-sessions on January 26, setting the stage for the main event January 27 – 28.

As always, TV Drama Vision brings together over 800 key industry delegates, including broadcasters, streamers, producers, financiers and creators from 35 countries, in the vibrant setting of cinema Draken and Hotel Draken.

TV Drama Vision moderators are Andrea Reuter, Marike Muselaers, Johanna 'Nunnu' Karppinen, Johanna Koljonen, Josefine Tengblad and Paolo Cicarelli.

Göteborg Film Fund

– Georgian Docs at Nordic Film Market

Göteborg Film Fund aims to strengthen the film industry in countries and regions with an interesting cinema on a high artistic level, but with different economic or political challenges and preconditions. Film Forum Sweden (Filmforum Sverige) is Göteborg Film Festival's arena for the Swedish film industry held at Folkteatern. Two days filled with talks, panels and networking focusing on inspiration, new visions, future-facing dialogue and skill development.

The 2026 programme explores responsibility, mandate, and survival – alongside audience development, the producer's role, and reclaiming the narrative of Swedish film.

Film Forum Sweden is available with all accreditations. The programme is in Swedish.

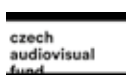

Founded in 1954 and restructured in 2004, the company supports the international visibility of German films across fiction, documentary, animation, and short film through close collaboration with leading global film festivals, professional market presence, the staging and supporting of worldwide Festivals of German Films, and strategic industry programs.

Its activities include organizing festival participation and industry pavilions, providing press and industry support, coordinating the German Oscar® submission, publishing market insights, offering targeted distribution and world sales support, as well as running talent programs.

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Filmförderungsanstalt FFA – German Federal Film Board

The FFA is Germany's national film funding institution. Supporting all areas of German cinema, the FFA is the central service structure for the German film industry. It conducts its business on the basis of the Film Promotion Act (FFG) and manages the Federal Government's incentive funding schemes DFFF and GMPF as well as the cultural film funding.

The FFA not only funds feature films at all stages of production and exploitation, but also cinemas, the preservation of German film heritage, the reception and promotion of German cinema abroad, and the provision of film education. Moreover, it regularly analyses and publishes market data of the domestic film, cinema, and video industries.

On an international level, the FFA collaborates with its partners from Europe and beyond to support development of cross-border projects and co-productions.

With an annual budget of roughly €43 million, FFF Bayern supports script and project development, production of feature films, TV movies and series, international co-productions, web formats, and more.

A key USP is a dedicated funding program exclusively designed for international co-productions of feature films and series, offering up to €2 million per project. To open all regions of Bavaria for filming, Film Commission Bayern provides a free, extensive location database and organizes customized scouting tours for international productions. The City of Munich, with its own Film Office, further strengthens Bavaria's appeal as a premier filming destination.

With an annual budget of around €35 million, the Film- und Medienstiftung NRW supports feature films, documentaries, high-end series, audio projects, games and immersive media across all stages of development, pre-production and production. Jury sessions are held five times a year, and tailored guidance helps producers navigate the application process and connect with local partners – making NRW a reliable and well-connected hub for ambitious international co-productions.

In recent years, major international film productions and high-end drama series have been shot here, including *The Hunger Games* by Francis Lawrence, Wes Anderson's *The Phoenician Scheme*, *John Wick* and *The Matrix Resurrections* starring Keanu Reeves, as well as the series *Babylon Berlin*.

With an annual budget of approximately €35 million the regional film fund MBB supports cinema productions, outstanding TV movies and TV series in all its stages: development, production, distribution, as well as digital postproduction and A-festival competition presence. MBB is open to exceptional national and international projects ranging from high-end art house to cinema blockbusters.

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Mitteldeutsche Medienförderung (MDM)

Mitteldeutsche Medienförderung GmbH (MDM) awards funding to promising film and media projects realised in the German federal states of Saxony, Saxony-Anhalt and Thuringia. The region offers excellent filming conditions – unique locations, excellent creative talent and service providers – and is home to numerous production companies with extensive experience in international co-productions.

In 2024, over 19 million euros in funding were invested in the development, production and distribution of a total of 174 film and media projects. facts lose their power?

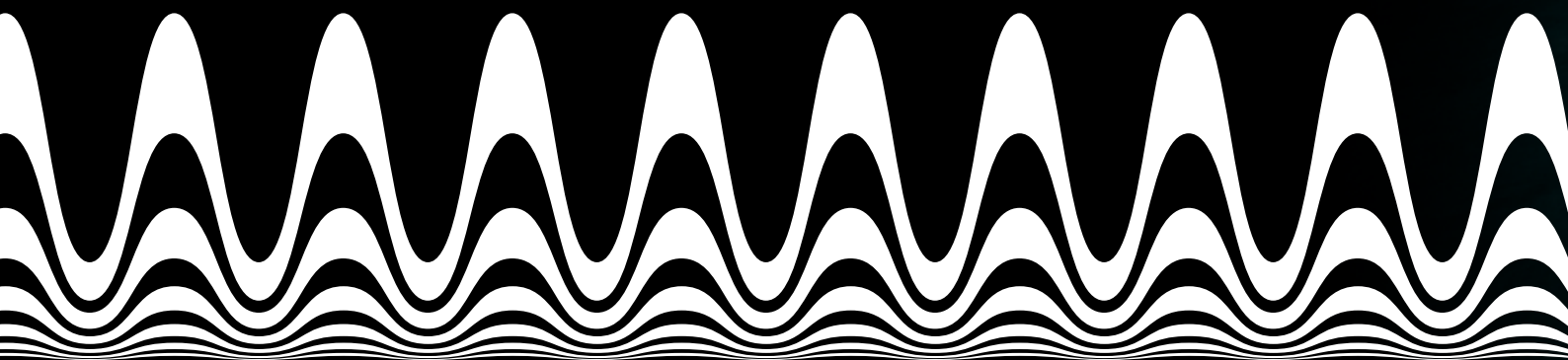
In an age where conspiracy thrives, facts are contested, and emotions often outweigh evidence, the very idea of truth has become a battleground. When the line between fiction and reality fades, who decides what is true – and for whom? As trust in institutions erodes and technology reshapes our grasp on authenticity, confronting the fragility of truth is not only urgent, but essential.

With **Focus: Truth**, the 49th Göteborg Film Festival explores how truth is shown, shaped, and questioned – on screen and off. From documentary pursuits of objectivity to autofiction, meta-cinema and

politically charged narratives, the programme highlights the ways in which cinema reflects, challenges and redefines our understanding of reality.

The special selection features 7 feature films and 4 documentary films that approach truth in different perspectives. The programme is accompanied by a Focus Seminar: Truth on January 25. Read more about the Focus seminar on page 32.

What is the *truth* worth to you?

At the heart of the project is a live lie detector test. In a custom-built interrogation room, people will undergo a real polygraph examination by a specialist. Those who confront the truth – and have it verified – will be rewarded with a Truth Ticket: a festival ticket earned through honesty.

Honorary Dragon Award

Agnieszka Holland

Agnieszka Holland, one of the most distinctive voices in European cinema, is the recipient of the 2026 Honorary Dragon Award. The acclaimed Polish director will attend the festival to receive the award, take part in an exclusive on-stage conversation, and present her latest film, *Franz*.

For decades, Holland has examined the many layers of truth – the uncomfortable, the contradictory, and the profoundly human – establishing herself as one of the most vital filmmakers of our time. With works such as *Europa Europa*, *In Darkness* and *Green Border*, she explores political and historical crises through an uncompromising humanist lens. Her films blend artistic precision with firm political engagement – an approach that has, at times, led to controversy, censorship, and even arrest.

In celebration of her remarkable career, the festival will also present a retrospective of her most iconic works. Holland returns to Göteborg Film Festival after first attending in 1979, as one of the directors behind the inaugural opening film *Screen Tests*.

Agnieszka Holland will receive the Honorary Dragon Award at the Nordic premiere of *Franz* at Stora Teatern on Friday, January 30, followed by an on-stage conversation.

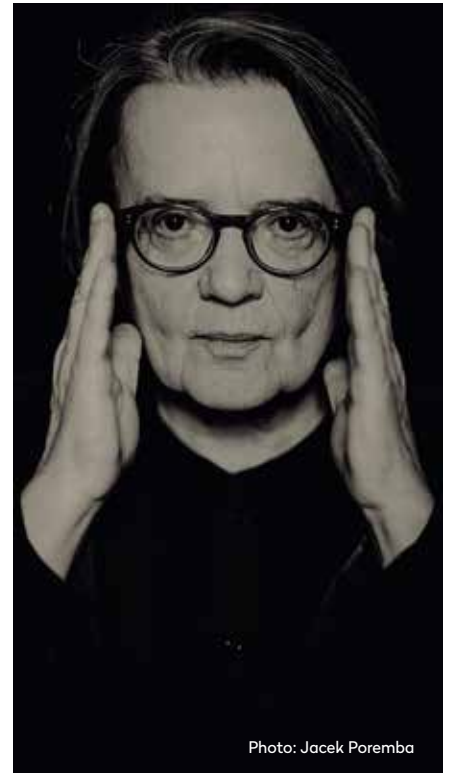

Noomi Rapace is the recipient of the Göteborg Film Festival's Nordic Honorary Dragon Award 2026.

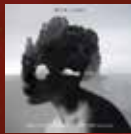
One of the Nordic region's most versatile performers, Swedish actor Noomi Rapace has built a career spanning languages, genres and continents. Her breakthrough as Lisbeth Salander in the screen adaptation of Stieg Larsson's *Millennium trilogy* earned her a Guldbagge Award and international acclaim. She has since delivered powerful performances in films such as Ridley Scott's *Prometheus* and Valdimar Jóhannsson's *Lamb*.

Rapace is currently receiving international praise for her bold and provocative portrayal of Mother Teresa in Teona Strugar Mitevska's *Mother*, which will be screened at the festival. In addition, a retrospective will highlight several of her most celebrated roles.

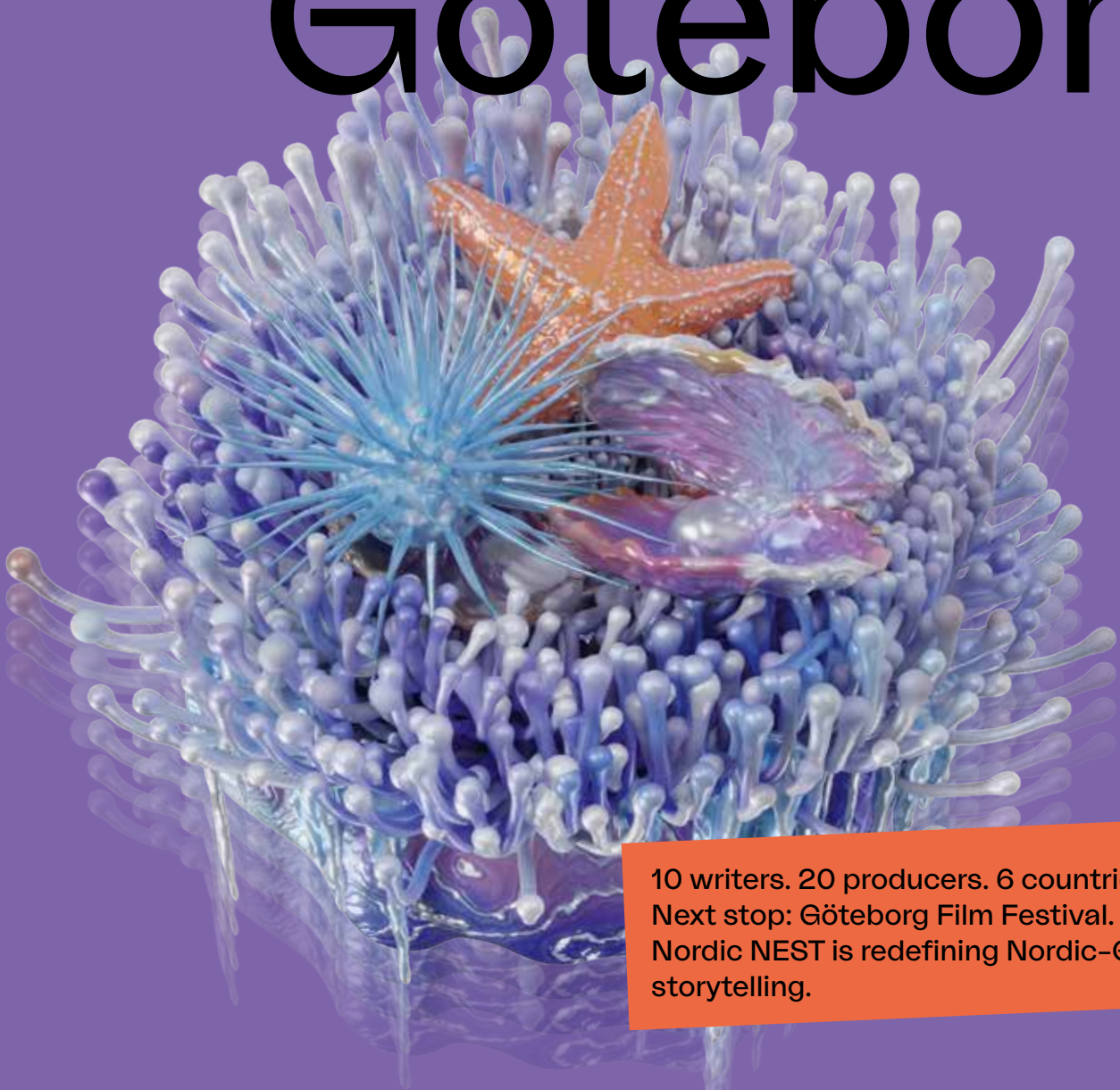
